Susan C. Schwab is the former U. S. Trade Representative (2006 – 2009), having served as a Cabinet member, and as the President's principal advisor, strategist, negotiator, and spokesperson on international trade and commerce matters. Upon leaving government, Schwab returned to the University of Maryland's School of Public Policy, where she previously served as Dean. Her career has spanned the public, private and non-profit sectors, with an emphasis on U.S. trade and competitiveness, including as President of the University System of Maryland Foundation, Director of Corporate Business Development for Motorola, Inc.; Assistant Secretary of Commerce and head of the U.S. & Foreign Commercial Service; Chief Economist and Legislative Director for Senator John C. Danforth (R-MO), and Trade Policy Officer at the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo. Ambassador Schwab serves on the boards of FedEx, Caterpillar, the U.S. Air Force Academy and Signature Theater. She holds a B.A. from Williams College, a Masters from Stanford University, and a Ph.D. from The George Washington University.
