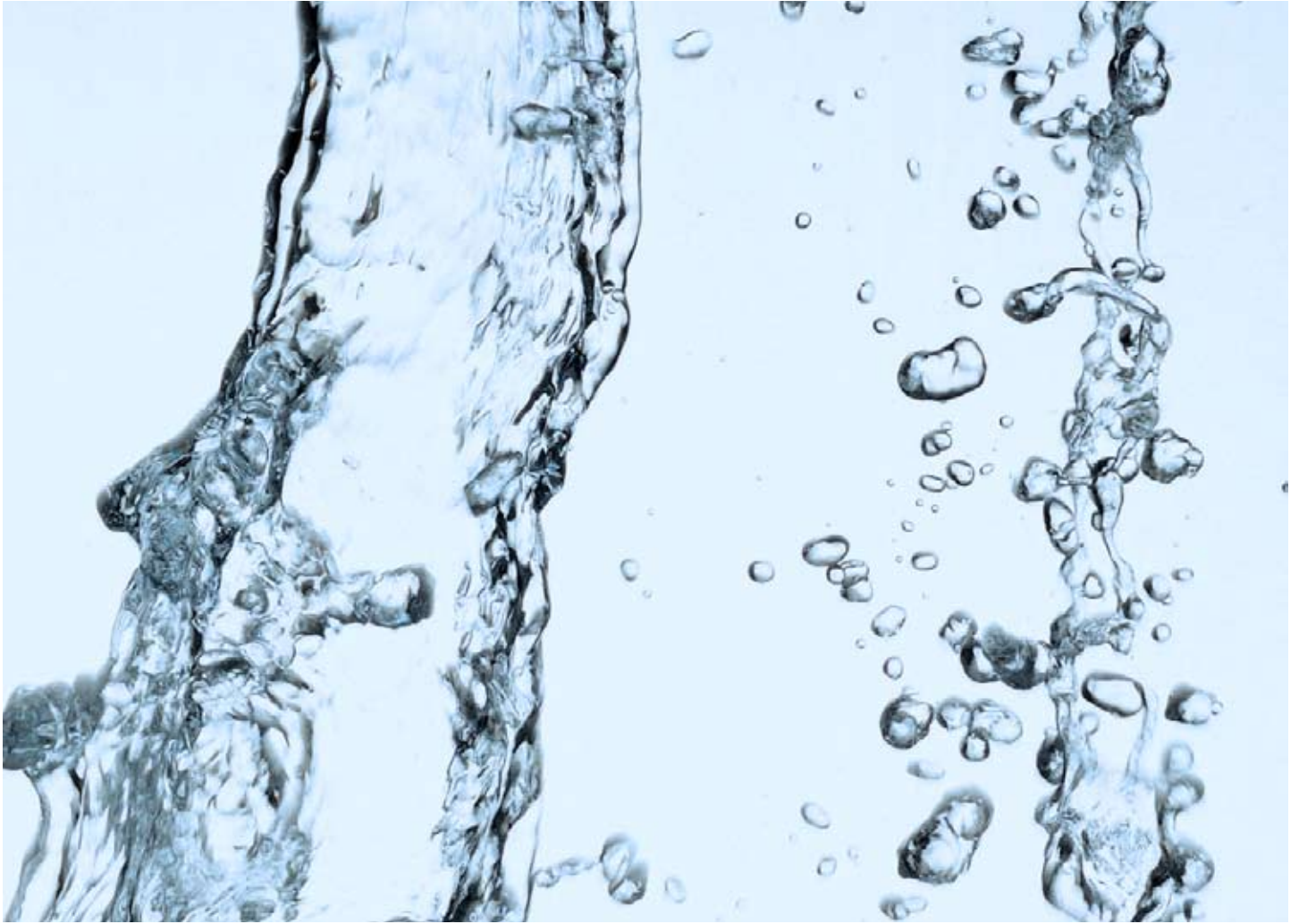

PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

Water utilities around the world have been confronted with rapidly changing institutional, regulatory and financial environments. Increasing and competing demands on water resources, inadequate regulatory capacity and lack of financial resources, are among many challenges confronting water utilities in many countries.

This executive programme on Excellence in Water Utilities Governance aims to meet the needs of water utilities to cope with the new challenges of institutional, regulatory, and financial environments. The course will expose participants to good practices in water utilities governance, practical guidance on managing water utilities effectively, and potential strategies to deal with existing and future challenges.

The programme will be held over one week in conjunction with the Singapore International Water Week (SIWW) in June 2009. During this week, the training will be conducted in a classroom setting where a combination of lectures, case studies will be used to enhance learning effectiveness.

During the Singapore International Water Week, the participants have the option to attend the site visits which would provide participants with first-hand experience in learning how PUB, the national water agency of Singapore, has dealt with challenges in water resource management. Site visits may include Membrane Bio-Reactor Demo Plant & WaterHub, NEWater Visitor Centre, PUB-ONE, Water Service Operation Centre, Woodleigh System Control, SingSpring Desalination Plant, Ulu Pandan NEWater Factory, Urban Redevelopment Authority

PARTICIPANT PROFILE

The programme is designed for mid-and-senior level managers in water utilities. It is also highly relevant to policy-makers, government officials, consultants, researchers and representatives of civil society who are concerned with the governance of water utilities.
