

BATAM'S REGIONAL POLICY OBJECTIVES ON RPJMD (1)

- 1. Development of the Riau Islands Province in the National Mid-Term Development Plan 2019 2024
 - a. Batam is directed as one of the growth corridors in the Kepulauan Riau Province
 - b. Strategic Area Development in the Kepulauan Riau Province:
 - Batam City is designated as a Free Trade Free Port Area (KPBPB);
 - Development of New Priority Tourism Destinations (DPP);
 - Aerospace Industry Development;
 - c. Major development projects for the Riau Islands Province, namely the Development of the Batam Bintan Region
- 2. Development of National Strategic Areas in the Kepulauan Riau Province
 - a. The Indonesian Sea Border Area, namely Nongsa/Putri
 - b. Free Trade Area and Free Port
- 3. Urban Area Development, Batam is directed as a trade and service center.



BATAM'S REGIONAL POLICY OBJECTIVES ON RPJMD (2)

- 4. The Batam area development policy is described as follows:
 - Development of Local and International Transportation Routes;
 - Construction of Roads, Bridges and Drainage;
 - Development of Main Infrastructure and Supporting Industrial Activities;
 - Development of Special Economic Zone (SEZ);
 - Development of Shipbuilding, Port Services, Warehousing, Offshore, and Electronic Industries;
 - Development of Logistics Ports;
 - Development of Galang Rempang Industrial and Tourism Area;
 - Made Batam as the Main Meeting Incentive, Convention & Exhibition (MICE)
 Tourism Destination in Indonesia;
 - Facilitation and Acceleration of Batam-Bintan Bridge Construction; and
 - Development of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) and Creative Economy.

CROSS-CUTTING POLICY

Cross-Cutting Policy is a number of local government's priority programs that will be implemented in the form of collaboration between regional and/or interdistrict/municipal apparatus organizations.

Countermeasures Poverty

Reducing the poverty rate from 6.07% in 2021 to 5.57% in 2026.

Countermeasures Stunting

Reducing stunting prevalence from 16.30% in 2021 will be 12.80% on year 2026.

Development Infrastructure

Increasing the Provincial Connectivity Ratio from 38.42% in 2021 will be 65% in year 2026.

Regional Cluster Agriculture

Increase the GRDP of the Agricultural Sector from 2.17 Trillion in 2021 will be 2.19 Trillion in year 2026.

Tourism Linkage Networking

Increase the GRDP of the Tourism Sector from 2.17 Trillion in 2021 will be 3.49 Trillion in year 2026.
