

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

This report highlights the career journeys of our 2018 graduates. The results are based on email surveys by our Career Services team, which were carried out in May and December 2018.

The LKY School saw 147 graduates in 2018, and 126 graduates (86%) responded to our surveys.

Of the respondents, 88% reported having found employment within 6 months post- graduation, across 25 countries. 18% of respondents reported that they have found new jobs in Singapore in 2018 and 22% indicated that they have secured a new job outside of Singapore.

Our 2018 graduates have found fulfilling work in line with their passions and values in the following sectors: Public (58%), Private (21%), Not-for-profit (12%), Multilaterals (3%) and Other organisations (2%). The remaining 4% did not specify their organisations.




Overview (Includes MPP, MPA & MPM)

Based on the combined responses from graduates within the MPP, MPA and MPM degree programmes, 48% of them reported that they have returned to work for a previous employer. 18% of the respondents reported that they found a new job in Singapore.



By Sector


The combined responses from graduates within the MPP, MPA and MPM degree programmes indicated that majority of the respondents went to the public sector (58%) followed by the private sector (21%).



By Job Function (Top 10)

Majority of the graduates from the MPP, MPA and MPM degree programmes who responded to the survey reported that they had job functions relating to Policy, Planning or Strategy (30%) followed by Administrative/ Human Resources (11.8%) and Consultant/Advisor (9.1%).

MASTER IN PUBLIC POLICY (MPP)


In the two-year Master in Public Policy (MPP) course, students focus on research and analysis, so that they can be effective in implementing, evaluating, and managing policies and programmes.

The MPP curriculum draws from economics, political science, and public management. A key component of the course is the Policy Analysis Exercise, where students undertake a public policy or management study for a client in the public, private, or not-forprofit sector. Their role is to conduct primary research and carry out in-depth analysis relating to an actual problem faced by their client, in order to offer policy recommendations.


CLASS OF 2018

58 out of 72 graduates responded to the graduate employment survey in 2018. Of the 58 respondents, 47 (81%) reported that they found employment. Of the 58 who responded, 12 (21%) indicated that they have returned to work for their previous employer. 27% reported that they found a new job in Singapore and 33% reported that they found a new job outside of Singapore.

In the one-year MPA programme, students seek to understand the issues that affect national, regional, and global policies and projects. Through decision-making and leadership training, they acquire the skills to be 21st century public managers, capable of transforming today's challenges into opportunities for innovation and excellence.



and present their findings and recommendations to the stakeholders.


CLASS OF 2018


MASTER IN PUBLIC MANAGEMENT (MPM)



EMPLOYMENT OVERVIEW




OF THOSE REPORTING EMPLOYMENT


