Professor Kenji Shibuya

Professor and Chair of Global Health Policy, University of Tokyo, Japan

Dr Shibuya is Chair Professor of Global Health Policy at the Graduate School of Medicine, University of Tokyo. He obtained his MD at the University of Tokyo and doctorate in international health economics at Harvard University.

He served at WHO in the Global Programme on Evidence for Health Policy and as Chief, Health Statistics and Evidence Unit, WHO from 2005-2008.

He is Chair of the Advisory Panel on Health Care for the Minister for Health, Labour and Welfare, and is the Executive Advisor on Global Health to the Japanese government.
