## PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES

The programme provides a unique opportunity for senior officers and professionals engaged in court and tribunal administration to learn together, from the programme and from each other through the exchange of ideas and best practices, to become better leaders. At the end of the programme, participants should be able to:

- Appreciate the core elements of effective leadership and good governance in court and tribunal administration to improve performance and to deliver excellent court services;
- Gain broader perspectives on complex multidisciplinary issues that govern the management of the courts and tribunals and to explore new management approaches and the latest innovations used around the world to improve court and tribunal performance;
- Acquire new leadership and management skills to achieve high performance and to confidently lead and manage teams in their own courts and tribunals; and
- Develop local and a global network of peers and resources to support continuous learning and improvement to achieve court excellence.

## WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This programme is specially designed for senior officers and professionals from the Courts, Tribunals and quasi-judicial institutions who are holding leadership positions or who will be assuming leadership positions in the near future and those involved in legal and judicial reform work. As the programme will be conducted in English, participants must be proficient in the language.
