#### **SUMMARY**

Razeen Sally is Associate Professor at the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy, National University of Singapore. He is also Chairman of the Institute of Policy Studies, Sri Lanka's leading economic-policy think-tank, and Senior Adviser to Hon. Mangala Samaraweera MP, Sri Lanka's minister of finance. He was Senior Lecturer in International Political Economy at the London School of Economics, where he also received his PhD. He did post-doctoral work at INSEAD prior to teaching at the LSE. He has held adjunct teaching, research and advisory positions at universities and think tanks in the USA, Europe, Africa and Asia. He was Chair of the World Economic Forum's Global Agenda Council on Competitiveness; Director, European Centre for International Political Economy in Brussels; Chair in Political Economy and Governance, IDEAS Malaysia; and Adjunct Scholar of the Cato Institute in Washington DC. He has been Visiting Professor at the Institut D'Etudes Politiques in Paris; Senior Visiting Research Fellow at the Institute of Southeast Asian Studies in Singapore; Visiting Fellow at the University of Hong Kong and the Australian National University; a Director of the Commonwealth Business Council in London; and Senior Research Associate of the South African Institute of International Affairs in Johannesburg. He is on the advisory boards of the Institute of Economic Affairs in London, the Centre for Independent Studies in Sydney, and the Cato Centre for Trade Policy Studies in Washington DC. He was awarded the Hayek Medal by the Hayek Society in Germany in 2011, and he is a member of the Mont Pelerin Society.

Razeen Sally's research and teaching focuses on global trade policy and Asia in the world economy. He has written extensively on the WTO, FTAs, and on different aspects of trade policy in Asia. He has also written on the history of economic ideas, especially the theory of commercial policy. Recently, he coordinated a major report on the competitiveness of cities for the World Economic Forum. Since 2015 he has been a senior adviser on economic policy to the government of his native Sri Lanka. He has consulted widely for governments, international organisations and businesses in Europe and Asia, and has worked for extended periods in the UK, France, Germany, Belgium, India, Sri Lanka, Singapore and Hong Kong. He writes frequently in international newspapers, and comments on international economic issues on radio and TV.
