Narrative

Mike Douglass is a Professor at the Asia Research Institute, where he is Leader of the Asian Urbanisms Cluster, and Professor at the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy at the National University of Singapore. He is Emeritus Professor and former Chair of the Department of Urban and Regional Planning at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa where he was also the Director of the Globalization Research Center. He received his Ph.D. in Urban Planning from UCLA. He previously taught at the Institute of Social Studies (Netherlands) and at the School of Development Studies, University of East Anglia (U.K.). He has also been a Visiting Scholar/Professor at Thammasat University, Tokyo University, Stanford University, UCLA, the National University of Singapore and the Korean Research Institute for Human Settlements.

With a professional focus on urban and regional planning in Asia, for many years he has lived, carried out research and engaged in professional practice in Asian countries, including in Japan, Korea, Indonesia, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam. He has been a consultant for major international development and donor agencies as well as national and local governments in Asia. He has also advised university programs on planning education in Asia, the U.S and Canada.

Research in Asia: (1) disaster governance; (2) livable cities (the environment, personal well-being, and social-cultural life); (3) globalization and the city; (4) international migration; (5) public and civic space; (6) governance and transborder intercity networks; (7) urban social movements and spaces of hope. Over the past 10 years he has been awarded grants totaling more than \$3 million.

Teaching: Sociology of cities and development planning in Asia, urban and regional planning in Asia; advanced planning theory; globalization and local development in Asia; filmmaking for social research and planning; special seminars for Ph.D. students on critical thinking, epistemologies and research.
