





Efforts are reducing the Persistence of Gender Inequalities










Areas of Development in the Road Map

Men's views about their roles:

- Unequal sharing of household chores
- Servitude versus partnership, segregation versus harmonizing
- Challenging societal concepts of what is masculine and feminine







Areas of Development in the Road Map

Men's views about home:

- Challenging the strict division of men seeing work as something done outside and home for rest
- With WFH and sharing of chores, men will have to do house work as part and parcel of running a household



Areas of Development in the Road Map

Men's view about home and work:

- Work is often associated with competition, conflict and conquest
- Concern of men in being able to do tasks independently and to do it well, in areas that they are unfamiliar with, such as doing housework and raising children.
- Will spouses and mothers be willing to relinquish areas of concerns like these to their male partners?







Areas of Development in the Road Map


Explore the values that support the roles:
