

## ***CV for Dr Yap Mui Teng***

*Dr Yap Mui Teng* is *Principal Research Fellow* at the Institute of Policy Studies, Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy, National University of Singapore where she leads research in the area of **Demography and Family**. She is also an Associate of the Changing Family in Asia cluster at the Asia Research Institute (ARI), National University of Singapore.

Her research interests include policy responses to low fertility in Singapore and elsewhere, policies on the aged, migration policies, and health and social policies in ageing societies.

Dr Yap has written and published on fertility and family planning, migration and ageing in Singapore and the region.
