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- Consequences for clients
- Written Informed Consent by Self or Proxy
- Participants have a right to withdraw
- Participants have access to support services
- Information collected can only be used for the purposes stated
- Ensure confidentiality and anonymity
- Inform limits of confidentiality
- Report accurately
- Avoid conflict of interests and dual relationships


