Beyond's Position

- We are a membership organisation where programme participants, staff, volunteers and donors identify themselves as members of a community who share the responsibility of getting disadvantaged young people out of the poverty cycle.
- You are a member of Beyond because you believe that you are a member of the community.





Facilitate Participation

Engage members in activities* where they can articulate:

- their aspirations, challenges and resources
- what they can offer and are willing to do
- what would make their membership meaningful

^{*}door knocking, walkabouts, celebrations, flea markets, "incidental" purposeful discussions, etc

An example





- Advocate rallying neighbours around a problem or a need
- Enabler organise aspirations into a work plan
- Motivator linking resources to support the plan





18 months later...





- Our ongoing research questions:
 - How have local communities been helping themselves?
 - How can we activate local communities to help themselves?
 - How can larger and local communities work together for a common good?



- How effectively are we building the village?
- How is the village evolving?
- How significant is the village in supporting its members?

 Research serves to intentionally engage stakeholder in mutual learning and cocreation of solutions that serve the common good

Conclusion

 A socially integrated society is not about getting people to change but getting people to be more accepting of each other and working toward a common good.

 Participatory Action Research has a role in keeping the community inspired in supporting their vulnerable members and in addressing the issues affecting this group.
