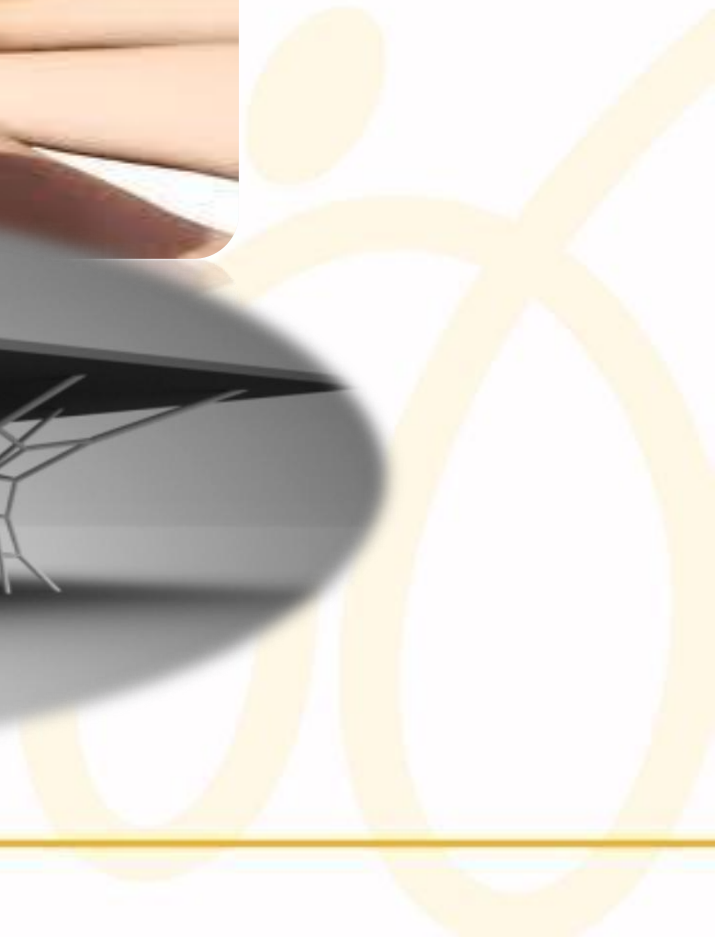
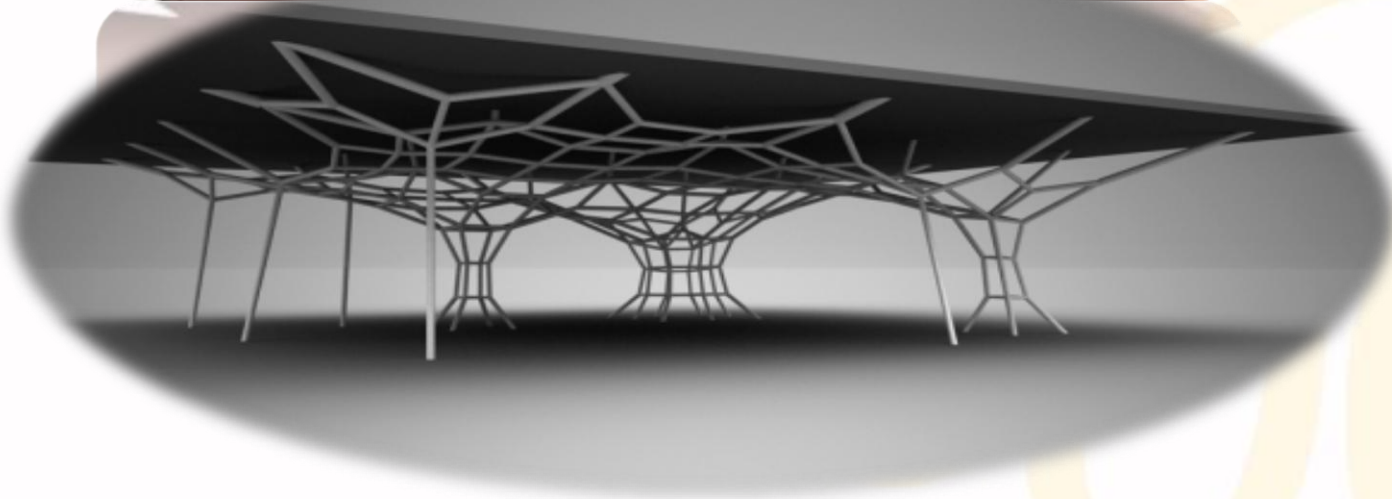

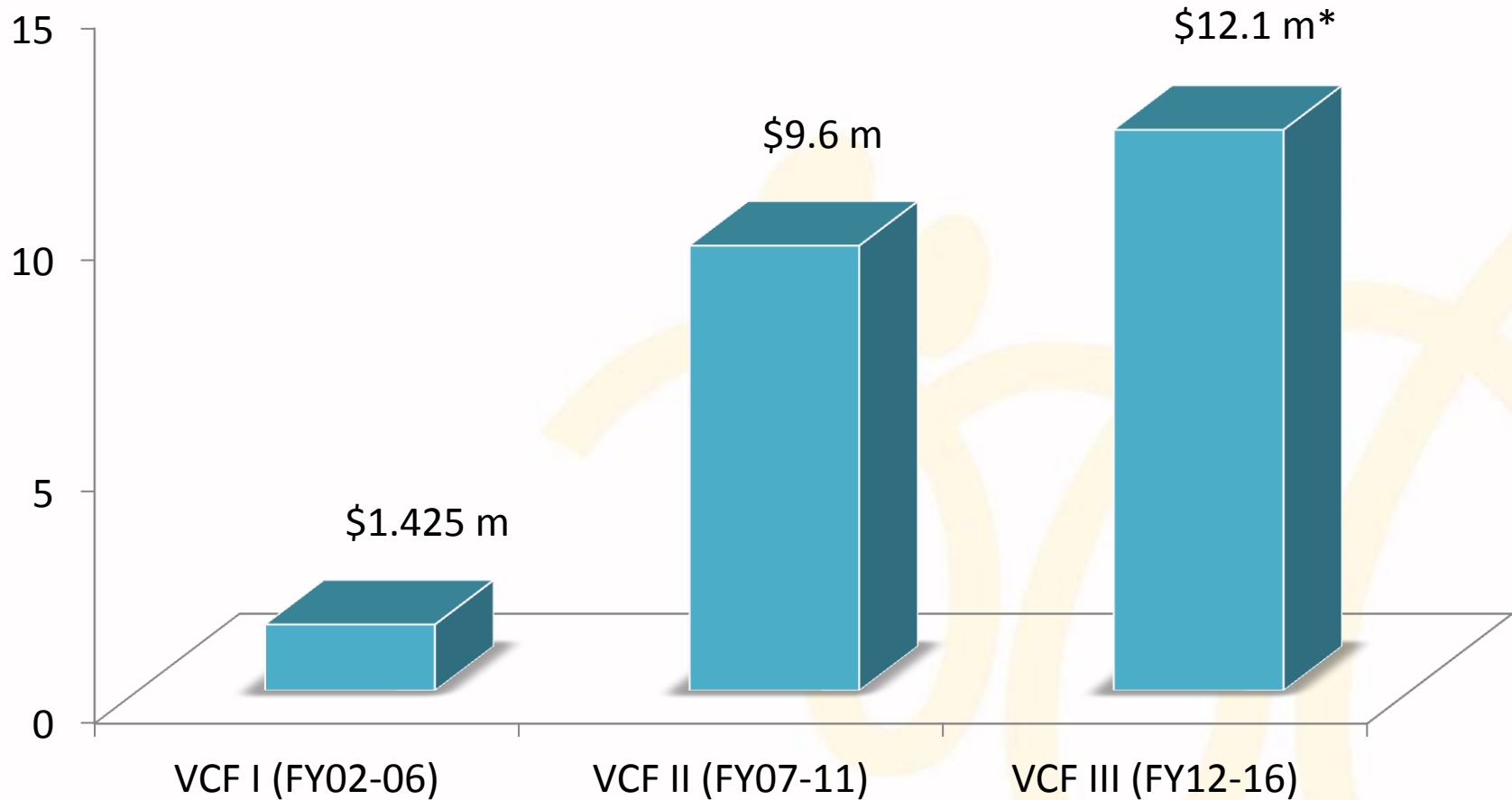


VCF Supports Research

- VCF funding has enabled VWOs to undertake research to:
 - Support and validate service improvements
 - Enhance current service delivery to better meet social needs
 - Project emerging social trends to help in the planning of prevention/ intervention services
- To-date, 41 research projects were supported.
 - Some examples:
 - Baseline Study on Early Intervention Programme for Infants and Children (EIPIC)
 - Research to Ascertain Assistive Technology Needs and Utilisation in Singapore
 - Expectation of Ageing in Singapore

Increasing VCF Support for Research

- VCF support for research-related items has been increasing.

- Measure efficiency in service
- Measure client satisfaction
- Identify most suitable client profile
- Establish best combination to optimize outcome



- **Enhance care & support for elderly & PWD with complex needs**
 - Medication compliance
 - Mental/emotional well-being
 - Basic health monitoring (e.g. wound, tongue, skin, etc)
- **Improve productivity output**
 - Complementing physical visits with virtual ones
 - Higher worker/client ratio

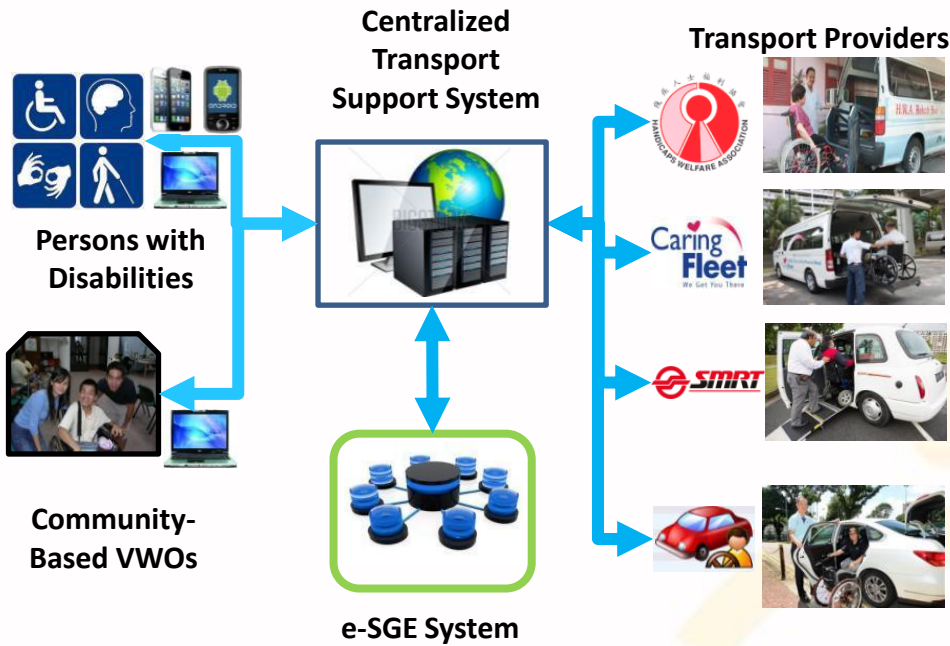
Video Monitoring Support (VMS) System

Leveraging both grounds up and centrally driven approach to have the “best of both worlds”

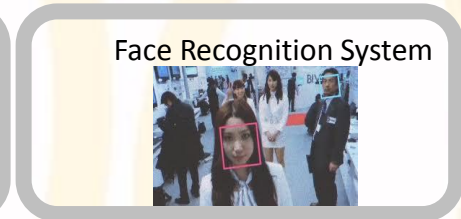
Examples of Centrally Driven Projects
