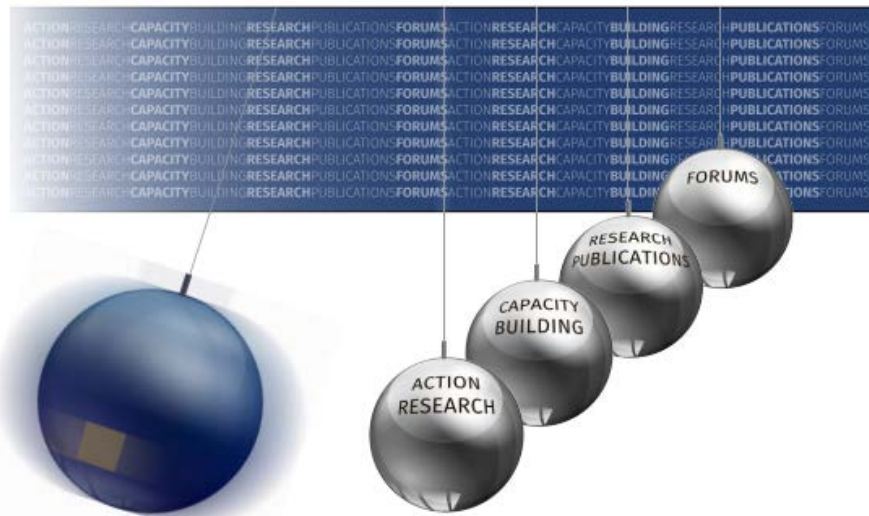

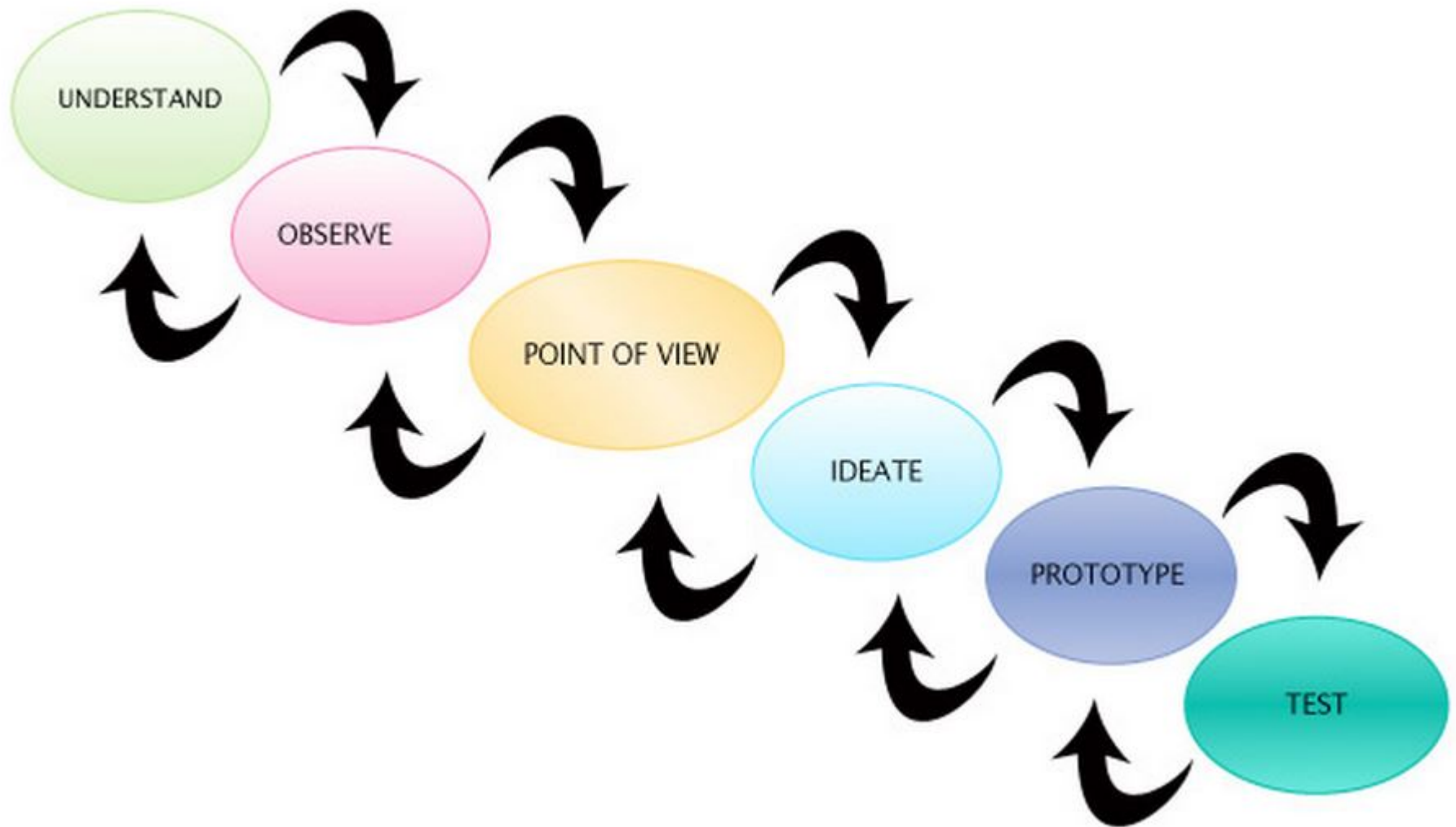


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The Lien Centre for Social Innovation at SMU catalyses innovative responses to social needs through applied research and capacity building in collaboration with the public, private and social sectors.

Primary data collection and participatory problem solving

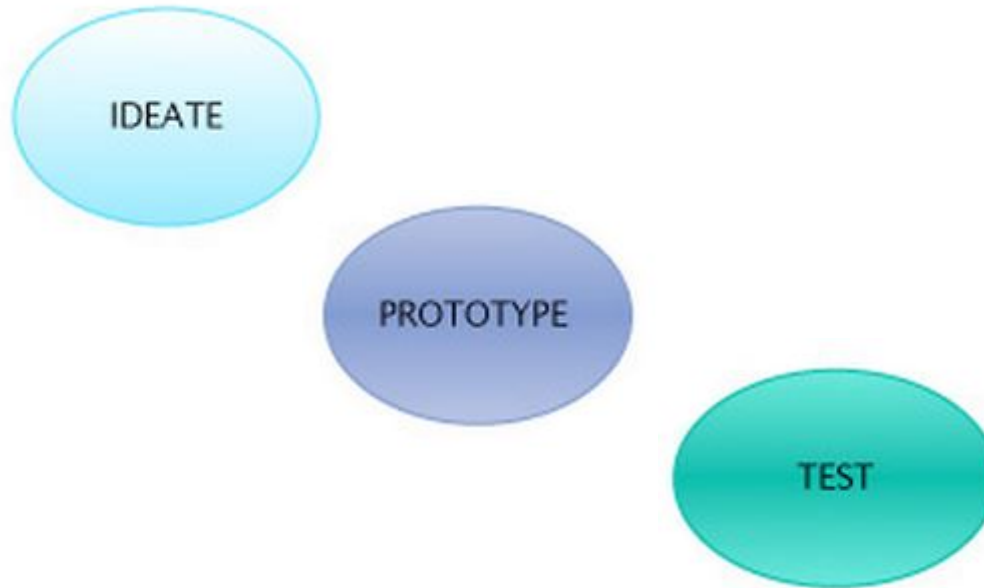


- Primary in-depth interviews

Tri-Sector Working Groups



- Broad community consultation
- Small team of VWOs, academics, businesses and community members, in consultation with civil servants, to review primary and secondary research findings
- Design and testing of new or improved social and welfare services

Translating Research to Concrete Solutions....

... requires *sustained* dialogue and interaction between researchers and policy-makers/practitioners about the implications of research findings

... requires a focus on outcomes from the earliest phase of research design

... may require intermediary organisations to design and manage these interactions

... can involve multiple parties beyond the academic/researcher and the social service delivery staff – tri-sector collaboration may contribute additional insights and outcomes
