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1. Limitations of Surveys

- Respondent Fatigue → Inaccurate Answers (Random response bias)
- 2. Social Desirability Bias
- 3. Personal Desirability Bias/Central Tendency Bias
- 4. Current Mood Bias
- 5. Measures sentiment, not conviction

2. Possible Concerns of Voters

- Two points as prelude
 - Every voter is 'rational'
 - They vote according to their own costs and benefits
 - Their costs and benefits may or may not be material
 - The Singaporean voter is not 'unique'

2. Possible Concerns of Voters

- Referendum on 4G and Lawrence Wong?
 - In 2020, flight to safety did not materialize: why?
- ii. Bread and Butter
 - Cost of living
 - Housing prices
- iii. Palestine
- iv. Fairness Issues
 - Perceptions of unjust treatment of candidates and gerrymandering
- v. Quality of Candidates
 - In plurality electoral systems, both party and candidate matter

2. Possible Concerns of Voters: ii. 'Bread and Butter'

- Cost of living
 - Utilities, town council fees, ERP
 - GST
 - Food and grocery prices!
- HDB
 - \$1m = 'psychological barrier'

Number of million-dollar HDB flats resold hit all-time high in June as resale prices rise 1.8%





2. Possible Concerns of Voters: iii. Palestine

- Overall approach of the government has remained, but there are some discernible shifts
 - UN votes; Air Drop; strong statements from Shanmugam and Vivian
- Question: has the government done enough for Palestine not to be an electoral issue?

2. Possible Concerns of Voters: iv. Fairness Issues

- GE 2020: First time voters rejected high-handed tactics
 - Raeesah Khan (part 1) incident; Alfian Sa'at
- Day after GE:
 - 'PAP needs to engage in "soul-searching" (Min. Shanmugam)
- Things to watch
 - Reactions to EBRC report (discussion on gerrymandering)
 - Whether similar tactics are used during the campaigns and lead-up to it



2. Possible Concerns of Voters: v. Quality of Candidates

- In plurality electoral systems (such as Singapore's), both party and candidate matter
- In 2020, opposition candidates were really good, PAP-esque
- Question: Who are the ones who will be fielded?
