
A commons is not a resource. ... it's a self-organized social system.




A community + a resource + social norms/practices


(more than just sharing & cooperation)

Relationality is what counts




The commons requires us to reconsider how we view the world




So how does all this relate to nonprofits? Is a nonprofit a commons?




