

ASEAN-Japan Trade and FDI

- Japan is ASEAN's second largest trading partner and the second largest source of foreign direct investment (FDI) to ASEAN.
- In 2015, two-way trade between ASEAN and Japan reached US\$239.4 billion, accounting for 10.5% of ASEAN's total trade.
- FDI inflows from Japan to ASEAN valued at US\$17.4 billion and accounted for 14.5% of total FDI inflows to ASEAN.





- The Toyota Motor Corporation (TMC) set up a project in 2002 for the international division of roles for vehicles sold in overseas market.
- This was the IMV (Innovative International Multi-purpose Vehicle) project, which consisted of three types of pickup trucks, a minivan, and an SUV.
- The production of major components is divided among ASEAN countries.
 For example, diesel engines are produced in Thailand, gasoline engines in Indonesia, transmission in the Philippines, and steering linkage in Malaysia.
- The vehicle assembly is performed in Thailand and Indonesia.
