
The Study

- 60 participants with an eligibility to vote recruited randomly based on 2010 population census
- Randomly assigned to 2 different experimental groups










Shifts in Epistemic Beliefs

 Only 1 out of 8 questions saw a significant shift in responses

"I don't think that it is possible for there to be more than one right opinion on this topic."







Implications

- Information with negative valence stoked sentiments
- Results in lower tolerance for different opinions on the issue
