SEEKING A BETTER URBAN FUTURE

Dr CHEONG Koon Hean is the Institute of Policy Studies' 5th S R Nathan Fellow for the Study of Singapore. This book is an edited collection of her three IPS-Nathan Lectures, delivered in March and April 2018, and includes highlights of her dialogue with the audience.

Dr Cheong's lecture series begins with the observation that Singapore is an anomaly. It is a city-state — everything that the country needs has to be accommodated within its island. And cities today, including Singapore, have to contend with growing complexity and disruptions from changes in demographics, climate, the economy, technology, and their people's evolving aspirations and expectations. Dr Cheong examines how cities have creatively dealt with these challenges, and discusses the considerations needed to plan and develop Singapore in the face of rapid change and uncertainty.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Dr Cheong Koon Hean is CEO of the Housing and Development Board (HDB) of Singapore, overseeing the development and management of some one million public housing flats in 26 towns and estates. Since joining the HDB in 2010, she has introduced a new generation of well-designed, sustainable and smart HDB towns. She was concurrently Deputy Secretary of the Ministry of National Development from 2001 to 2016.

Dr Cheong was CEO of the Urban Redevelopment Authority from 2004 to 2010, in charge of strategic land-use planning, conservation of built heritage and the real estate market. She played a key role in the planning and development of major growth areas, such as Singapore's Marina Bay and the Sino-Singapore Tianjin Eco-City. She is also Chairman of the Lee Kuan Yew World City Prize's nominating committee. A recipient of several awards, Dr Cheong is the first Asian to be conferred both the Urban Land Institute's JC Nichols Prize for Visionaries in Urban Development and the Council on Tall Buildings and Urban Habitat's Lynn S. Beedle Lifetime Achievement Award, in 2016.

About THE S R NATHAN FELLOWSHIP FOR THE STUDY OF SINGAPORE and THE IPS-NATHAN LECTURE SERIES

The S R Nathan Fellowship for the Study of Singapore was established by the Institute of Policy Studies (IPS) in 2013 to support research on public policy and governance issues. With the generous contributions of individual and corporate donors, and a matching government grant, IPS raised around S\$5.9 million to endow the Fellowship.

The Fellowship is named after Singapore's sixth and longest-serving President, the late S R Nathan, in recognition of his lifetime of service to Singapore.

Each S R Nathan Fellow, delivers a series of IPS-Nathan Lectures during his or her term. These public lectures aim to promote public understanding and discourse on issues of critical national interest. The lectures are then edited and compiled in a book.
