










Falling Marriage Rate among younger age groups

Age-Sex Specific Marriage Rates




Resident Singlehood and Singlehood Rates (20-44)








Rise in portion of Single among Resident Population













Higher age of 1st marriage among "Primary or Lower" educational group












Increasing median age among remarriages























Decreasing Total Fertility Rate among the young












Singapore's divorce rates lowest among OECD countries







Younger married persons more vulnerable to divorce




Age-Sex specific divorce rates








Early divorces are of concern

Proportion of Divorces With Marriages Under 5 Years








Divorces among older marriages

DIVORCES AMONG LONG LASTING MARRIAGES (20 YEARS OR MORE)









Future Marriage Intention



Conclusion

- Overall, a majority of Singaporeans still believe in marriage and want children

However, trends need to be addressed:

- Rising singlehood rates
- Singaporeans are getting married and having children later
- Couples are desiring and having fewer children
- Rising divorce rates, especially among the young
- Competing aspirations seem to affect marriage and parenthood decisions
