- Institutions with "monopoly on the legitimate use of force" (Weber)
- Regulators, externality managers, custodians of the large and long view

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#### **Community**


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#### **State**

- Aim to coexist with others and steward for common gain

- Sing Lit

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Tagore – "not ... a uniformity that is dead, but ... a unity that is living"

### Strong states can have varying intentions too

- Paternalist intervention
- State as Control tower
- Rowing
- Rule-setting & enforcement

- Convene, facilitate, partner
- State as Network and Platform
  - Steering, not rowing
- Rule-setting, some enforcement

### Implications for Singapore

#### **Constitutive Community**

Responsible communities can usefully complement state perspectives

Some collaboration is useful. But respectful distance (coexistence) can be okay too

#### **Constrictive State**

State powers can usefully check chauvinism ...

### **Enabling State**

... but can reinforce it too.

### Some closing thoughts

- Pragmatic idealism (Koh) takes constant effort but is the bedrock of Singaporean exceptionalism.
- Trust (amidst risk) is key to arrive at, and stay in, the top right.
- In other quadrants, there can be dangers of a self-fulfilling Nash Equilibrium.
- Strategic interests and human needs should drive policy not administrative efficiency alone.
- Deliberative spaces and participatory policymaking help build mutual familiarity, trust and predictability, to avoid less optimal outcomes.
