THE IDEA OF SINGAPORE: SMALLNESS UNCONSTRAINED

Professor TAN Tai Yong is the Institute of Policy Studies' 6th S R Nathan Fellow for the Study of Singapore. This book is an edited collection of his six IPS-Nathan Lectures, delivered between September 2018 and May 2019, and includes highlights of his dialogue with the audience.

In his lecture series, Professor Tan examines how Singapore has evolved over its 700-year history as a regional emporium, colonial port city and city-state. He shows that Singapore's history is influenced by the recurring themes of geography, movements of people, networks and globalisation. An understanding of the twists and turns of this long history, and the ways in which historical circumstances have shaped Singapore's fate and fortunes, can offer important insights and a better appreciation of our strengths and challenges as a city-state.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Professor TAN Tai Yong is President and Professor of Humanities (History) at Yale-NUS College.

Prior to becoming president in 2017, Professor Tan served as the College's Executive Vice President (Academic Affairs) (2014 to 2017). He also served as Co-Chair of the joint Yale and NUS committee that hired inaugural faculty members in the humanities and shaped the common curriculum in 2011.

A graduate of NUS, Professor Tan completed his doctorate at Cambridge University. He has been a faculty member of the NUS Department of History since 1992 and served the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences as Sub-Dean (1994–1999), Head of the History Department (2000–2003), Vice Dean (2001–2003), and Dean (2004–2009). Professor Tan was previously Vice Provost (Student Life) (2010–2014) at NUS. He was Founding Director of the Institute of South Asian Studies, NUS (2004 to 2015). He received Teaching Excellence Awards in 1992 and 2000.

Professor Tan is Honorary Chairman of the National Museum of Singapore, Chairman of the National Collection Advisory Panel and Academic Research Panel at the National Heritage Board, and a member of the Indian Heritage Centre Advisory Board. He was appointed to the Singapore Social Sciences Research Council in 2016, and is a member of the Singapore Bicentennial Advisory Panel. Professor Tan served as a Nominated Member of Parliament from 2014 to 2015. He was awarded the Public Administration Medal (Silver) at the 2009 National Day Awards.

President Tan specialises in South and Southeast Asian History, and has authored and coauthored several books, including Seven Hundred Years: A History of Singapore (2019); Creating "Greater Malaysia" (2008); The Garrison State (2005) and The Aftermath of Partition in South Asia (2001).

The S R Nathan Fellowship for the Study of Singapore was established by the Institute of Policy Studies (IPS) in 2013 to support research on public policy and governance issues.
