## A) TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 1. Participation in the IPS Women's Conference 2021 is free of charge, but **registration is compulsory.** All registrations are subject to approval by the Institute.

## **B) CODE OF CONDUCT**

#### Behaviour

- All participants should refrain from any offensive, threatening, discriminatory or harassing verbal expression or behaviour while participating in the conference. Any such verbal expression or behaviour, including but not limited to in relation to race, religion, gender identity, politics, sexual orientation, disability or age, is absolutely prohibited. Harassment includes, but is not limited to, any use of abusive or degrading language, intimidation, stalking, harassing photography or recording, inappropriate physical contact or unwelcome sexual attention.
- Do not disrupt the virtual meeting or engage in harm or threats of harm of any kind. Do not create/contribute to a safety threat or unsafe or exclusionary situation.
- Copyright of the conference sessions is owned by the Institute. IPS reserves all rights associated with the sessions, including (without limitation), the rights to all recordings or reproductions of presentations at this conference.
- Any photography, filming, taping, recording, or reproduction in any medium, including via the use of tripod-based equipment or screen recording applications, of any of the programmes presented at the conference without the express written consent of IPS is strictly forbidden. Limited photography for strictly personal, social, or non-commercial use is permitted.

- IPS reserves the right in its sole discretion to refuse participation to IPS Women's Conference 2021 to any person or to remove or prohibit any person from participating in the conference, including but not limited to any person who behaves in an inappropriate, disorderly, disrespectful or dangerous manner or who fails to comply with the IPS Women's Conference 2021 Code of Conduct.
- This Code of Conduct may be revised at any time by IPS and the terms are non-negotiable.
