Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy Expands Scholarship Opportunities for Truman Scholars

25 July 2024, Singapore – The Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy (LKYSPP) is pleased to announce an enhanced scholarship arrangement with The Harry S. Truman Scholarship Foundation for Truman Scholars admitted to its <u>Master in International Affairs (MIA)</u>, <u>Master in Public Policy (MPP)</u>, or <u>Master in Public Administration (MPA)</u> programmes. This collaboration, which commences from Academic Year 2025 and extends through Academic Year 2027, underscores LKYSPP's commitment to attracting and nurturing global leaders in public service.

Under this arrangement, Truman Scholars will receive SGD 20,000 per year for full-time studies, tenable for the normal candidature period. Specifically, MIA and MPP students will receive a total of SGD 40,000, while MPA students will receive SGD 20,000. This initiative aims to provide significant financial support and encourage American students to broaden their perspectives by studying in Asia. Additionally, Truman Scholars who have not previously received a Singapore government subsidy or sponsorship by a Singapore government agency in a graduate programme will benefit from a subsidised tuition fee rate for MPP and MPA. This subsidy is funded by Singapore's Ministry of Education and will remain in effect as long as the ministry continues to provide it.

"We welcome the enhanced collaboration with The Harry S. Truman Scholarship Foundation, offering increased support for Truman Scholars who join our prestigious programmes," said Professor Danny Quah, Dean of LKYSPP.

"Important discussions that shift global trade and power politics are also in Asia, and LKYSPP is at the heart of the region, uniquely positioned to equip aspiring leaders in public policy drive those conversations and analysis from an Asian perspective. We look forward to welcoming more American students to our vibrant academic community, and fostering stronger international ties," added Prof Quah.

This partnership aligns with LKYSPP's mission to educate and train policymakers and leaders, raising the standards of governance and improving lives across the region and beyond. The school offers a unique educational opportunity, providing an Asian perspective on global developments and international affairs, and is part of the National University of Singapore (NUS), which is ranked 1st in Asia and 8th globally according to the Britain-based Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) World University Rankings 2025.
