# **Small Islands: Sustained Complexity?**

The **United Nations Development Programme** (UNDP) and the **Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy** are hosting an international conference entitled *Development on Small Islands: What does a complexity approach have to offer?* The Prime Minister of Tonga, Lord Tu'ivakano, will deliver a keynote address, followed by Oxfam Senior Strategic Adviser, Duncan Green.

The conference provides a platform to consider the value of complexity-aware approaches to tackling development challenges on Small Island Developing States (SIDS). The nonlinear nature of development processes and requires public services to deal with high complexity, acknowledging that there are no simple answers, even in a small island context.

This year the United Nations are convening the *Third International Conference on Small Island Developing States* (www.sids2014.org) focused on this group of countries that remain a special case for sustainable development in view of their unique and particular vulnerabilities. Complex adaptive systems thinking potentially offers decision-makers an approach that offers more sustainable responses to development challenges.

This is the first such conference organized jointly by the UNDP Global Centre for Public Service Excellence and the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy.
