## Second edition of Singapore-France Economic Forum

A High Level economic Forum that Explores Bilateral Economic Relations Between Europe and Asia

The Cercle des économistes, the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy, National University of Singapore and the Economic Society of Singapore are organizing, with the support of the French Embassy in Singapore and the local authorities, the second edition of the Rencontres Économiques in Singapore. This event will officially conclude the Year of Innovation France-Singapore, decreed jointly at the highest level of the two states. The goal of this initiative is to develop a strategic partnership and to recognize innovation as a driver for transforming our economies and societies. France and Singapore have therefore decided to intensify their cooperation in research and innovation.

Inspired by Les Rencontres Économiques d'Aix-en-Provence in France, Les Rencontres Économiques in Singapore will take place on les 14 et 15 march 2019 on the campus of the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy with the central theme: « New Horizons for the World Economy ».

The two-day forum brings together a panel of 40 esteemed speakers from varied backgrounds (academia, business leaders, policy makers) and offers an in-depth exploration of the bilateral economic relations between Europe and Asia through a series of insightful presentations, panel discussions, and open debates.to explore the economic relations between Europe and Asia, Key topics such as globalization, inequalities, innovation, the determinants of growth and regional integration.

The major question posed in these debates will be that of the necessary confidence of countries and peoples among themselves and in a model of globalization that benefits everyone. The speakers will then question the best tools and initiatives to take to achieve this.
